The quantitative analysis of microscopic pictures has for a long time been subordinated to the qualitative description. This may partly have been caused by the preference of the human mind for pattern recognition rather than quantitative appraisal, which leads to judgements based on impressions subconsciously tested against the observer's (mental) image of the normal pattern. Another cause may have been the time-consuming difficulties of collecting and computing quantitative information. During the past decades the usefulness of quantitative methods in histo- and cytopathology has been stressed for many different subjects. In addition, minicomputers have become widely available and are becoming increasingly inexpensive; the more so since the introduction of microcomputers.
