Rizvi also discusses the literal and contextual meaning of "mawla" which has great bearing on the issue of Imāmat and khilāfat of 'Ali bin Abi Tālib. Chapter IV, he surveys the current dispute on the explicitness versus implicitness of 'Ali's appointment to the position of imāmate and Khālifat. This is followed by a chapter on the concept of 'Ahlul Bayt' in the Qur'ān and the sunnah. Chapter VI deals with the wilāyat, the position and authority of the Imam, and its scope from the Qur'ānic point of view. The treatise ends with a discussion on the esoteric knowledge that the Prophets
