**Sayyid Qutb and the Origins of Radical Islamism** John Calvert 2009-11-22 Sayyid Qutb (1906-1966) was an influential Egyptian ideologue credited with establishing the theoretical basis for radical Islamism in the post colonial Sunni Muslim world. Lacking a pure understanding of the leader's life and work, the popular media has conflated Qutb's moral purpose with the aims of bin Laden and al-Qaeda. He is often portrayed as a terrorist, Islamo-Fascist, and advocate of murder. This book rescues Qutb from misrepresentation, tracing the evolution of his thought within the context of his time. An expert on social protest and political resistance in the modern Middle East, as well as Egyptian nationalism, John Calvert recounts Qutb's life from the small village in which he was raised to his execution at the behest of Abd al-Nasser's regime. His study remains sensitive to the cultural, political, social, and economic circumstances that shaped Qutb's thought-major developments that composed one of the most eventful periods in Egyptian history. These years witnessed the full flush of Britain's tutelary regime, the advent of Egyptian nationalism, and the political hegemony of the Free Officers. Qutb rubbed shoulders with Taha Husayn, Naguib Mahfouz, and Abd al-Nasser himself, though his Islamism originally had little to do with religion. Only in response to his harrowing experience in prison did Qutb come to regard Islam and kufr (infidelity) as oppositional, antithetical, and therefore mutually exclusive. Calvert shows how Qutb repackaged and reformulated the Islamic heritage to pose a challenge to authority, including those who claimed (falsely, he believed) to be Muslim.

The Qu'ran does not prescribe one timeless and unchanging social structure for men and women, Wadud argues lucidly, affirming that the Qu'ran holds greater possibilities for guiding human society to a more fulfilling and productive

mutual collaboration between men and women than as yet attained by Muslims or non-Muslims.

Furthermore, she examines the evolving status and roles of Muslim women both in their religious communities and in the larger societies. The book challenges representations of Islam and Muslims as alien to Europe, which overlook the fact that Europe has considerable indigenous Muslim populations in its southeastern part as well as societies that have developed

certain models of negotiating cultural differences.

**Dell'umana fratellanza e altri dubbi** Brunetto Salvarani 2020-12-21T00:00:00+01:00 Un confronto serrato – fra speranza e disincanto – a due anni dallo storico accordo sulla fratellanza umana firmato ad Abu Dhabi da papa Francesco e lo Shaykh Ahmad Al-Tayyeb (4 febbraio 2019). Il “Documento sulla fratellanza

umana per la pace mondiale e la convivenza comune” – firmato nel 2019 ad Abu Dhabi da papa Francesco e lo Shaykh di Al-Azhar Ahmad al-Tayyeb – resta un evento storico di portata mondiale. In quella occasione i due protagonisti discussero, fra l'altro, del progetto della Casa della famiglia di Abramo (Abrahamic Family House), edificio destinato ad accogliere una moschea, una chiesa e una sinagoga a una ventina di minuti dall'aeroporto di Abu Dhabi, in funzione del dialogo fra le tre fedi. Nonostante i proclami, non ci si può nascondere che per gli uomini e le donne del nostro tempo è diventato sempre più difficile riconoscersi come un'unica grande famiglia umana. In questo confronto a due voci, i due studiosi Adnane Mokrani e Brunetto Salvarani riflettono senza infingimenti, anche di fronte alle tensioni internazionali e ai conflitti in cui l'elemento etnico-religioso sembra essere tornato prepotentemente alla ribalta. Nessun documento può cambiare il mondo. La lettera non ci cambia, invece la parola che diventa vita ed etica trasforma e dà speranza per il cambiamento. Questo vale anche per il “Documento sulla fratellanza umana” e per l'enciclica Fratelli tutti. Non è una dichiarazione scritta che cambia le cose, siamo noi che cambiamo la realtà, quando applichiamo i valori di quei testi nelle nostre vite. La vera domanda è: fino a che punto siamo seri nell'adottare quelle parole?
