WebJun 22, 2016 · Include an explanation for why you are using direct quotations in a paper. To increase readability or flow, you may include a linking sentence or phrase that introduces the quote, an author identification (within the text or a parenthetical citation), and an explanatory or interpretative sentence. For example:

WebIn the middle of a sentence use a space before and after the ellipsis. At the end of a sentence use four dots total. The first is the period (without a preceding space), followed by three dots. Each of the four dots is followed by a space. Money For specific amounts, use the dollar sign instead of the word "dollars." Example: The budget is \$10 ...

WebWriters should use quotations as support for an argument; they are not arguments in and of themselves. Thus, quotations need to be incorporated using a three step process (introduction, presentation, explanation). Introduction – Provide the context your reader needs to make sense of the quote.

Web1. INTRODUCE: Introduce all your quotes using introductory phrases. Here are some examples: • According to Michael Smith, "you should use the author's first and last name when you cite that author for the first time in your paper" (1). • As Smith explains, "you can introduce your quotes with a number of different phrases" (1).

WebThis type of bracketing is useful for inserting necessary detail or changing grammar, but should be used sparingly. Ellipses (...) are used in the quote above because part of the quote has been omitted. (Ellipses are not required immediately after the opening quotation mark or before the closing quotation mark). WebJun 4, 2015 · general rule of thumb is that no more than fifteen percent of your paper should be directly- quoted material. Therefore, when you can convey the idea just as effectively in your own words through the use of summary or paraphrase, do so. The purpose of using outside sources is to support your own ideas.

WebUsing Quotations in Scientific Writing Unlike other styles of writing, scientific writing rarely includes direct quotations. Why? Quotations usually detract from the point you want to communicate. Quotations do not reflect original thinking. Inexperienced writers may be tempted to quote, especially when they don't understand the content.

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WebPart One: Using Quotations Quotations increase your essay's credibility and validate and support the points you are making. Quotations, however, do not substitute for your own ideas. Use quotes sparingly, usually no more than one-fifth of your essay.

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WebBlock Quotes A quotation of at least five lines or at least two paragraphs should be placed in block format without quotation marks. Indent the entire quotation 0.5"—the same as a standard paragraph indent. According to Kate L. Turabian's A Manual for Writers, block quotes should be single spaced (Turabian 2013, 349).

WebHow to Use Quoted Material: Always introduce the quote: Do not use a quote unless you have contextualized the quote in some way. Introduce quotes by providing the author's full name and/or the title of the material from where the quote was taken. Once you have stated the author's full name the first time, you may use their last name for each

Webyour paper. Use brackets [] to show where you have added/changed words. Ellipsis An ellipsis is a set of three spaced dots ... that is used when you omit words from a quote, in which case you must replace the omitted words with an ellipsis. If you need to use ellipses at the end of a sentence, use three dots plus the period.
