There may be only a few levels between the top executives and the newest members in an MLM company's structure, known as a flat hierarchy. An MLM company model may have responsibilities for the CEO, distributor, sales representative, sponsor, and recruiter. There is typically a compensation strategy in place. Every sales representative above the lowest level typically shares in the profits from sales made by those below them. In MLMs, salespeople are compensated with fixed commissions rather than hourly pay at all levels. The representatives' primary objective is finding new distributors, but they can also make money by promoting and selling the company's goods.
