After the war, her attention was focused on the creation of a Jewish homeland in a binational (Arab-Jewish) state of Israel. In 1961 she attended Adolf Eichmann's trial in Jerusalem. Her report on that trial, *Eichmann in Jerusalem*, provoked an immense controversy, which culminated in her virtual excommunication from the worldwide Jewish community.
