**Gathered in my Name** William T. Cavanaugh 2020-12-28 This volume differs from many quincennial discussions of the Protestant Reformation—and ecumenical scholarship more generally—in that it shifts the focus from Europe and the West to the global South, where ecumenism’s promises and challenges are quite different. In postcolonial and post-missionary Africa, the churches continue to expand, competition among denominations is lively, and Christian rivalry with Islam is often a reality. Donne migranti dall'est e pratiche di transnazionalismo** Stefania Salvino 2019-02-20 “Per minestra e per libro” è una citazione tratta da un’intervista ad una migrante ucraina che riassume i motivi che hanno spinto schiere di madri migranti (dagli Est e dai Sud del mondo) a lasciare le loro famiglie

per recarsi a lavorare nell'Occidente capitalista. Il libro presenta i risultati di una ricerca sulla migrazione contemporanea delle donne ucraine in Italia, mettendo a fuoco aspetti, dinamiche e modelli migratori comuni a tanti flussi migratori femminili, specie dall'Est Europa. Nello specifico la migrazione femminile ucraina verso l'Italia, sviluppatasi pochi anni dopo la caduta del Muro di Berlino, ha assunto col tempo un peso considerevole, configurandosi come un fenomeno rilevante sia in termini numerici che di strategie di radicamento sul territorio: si tratta di una tra le più numerose collettività di stranieri residenti in Italia, stabile tra la prime cinque posizioni da oltre quindici anni, nonché la più ampia riserva di manodopera di cura sul territorio nazionale. La ricerca ha, così, esplorato ed interpretato l'esperienza migratoria di quattro diversi profili di donna migrante: la migrante a tempo indeterminato, la cui biografia personale e sentimentale sono ormai radicate in Italia; la migrante a tempo determinato, il cui progetto è di fare ritorno in un tempo ancora indefinito in Ucraina, dove è rimasta la propria famiglia; la migrante di ritorno, ovvero colei che ha optato per il ritorno definitivo nel paese di origine; e la migrante pendolare, la cui esperienza migratoria si sviluppa mediante l'alternanza con un'altra donna su uno stesso posto di lavoro. Sullo sfondo riecheggia un altro profilo, quello dei migranti di riflesso, ossia dei figli e degli altri familiari di queste donne, la cui esperienza migratoria è vissuta di riflesso, in maniera cioè indiretta, attraverso l'assenza delle migranti. A partire dai profili tracciati, si è, dunque, cercato di rispondere alle questioni poste all'inizio della ricerca. Come si profila la transnazionalità nell'esperienza migratoria delle donne ucraine in Italia? Con quali caratteri specifici e con quale evoluzione nelle biografie migranti? Il risultato finale è l'elaborazione di una tipologia di esperienze migratorie, prodotta per astrazione dalle narrative biografiche raccolte nel corso delle interviste in Italia e in Ucraina.

Tali disuguaglianze non sono un esito naturale dei rapporti economici e del progresso tecnologico: è necessario identificarne le cause nei processi di formazione della ricchezza, nelle politiche macroeconomiche e di regolamentazione, nelle politiche di sviluppo oltre che nel cambiamento del senso comune. Chi non ha reddito e ricchezza, chi non può accedere ai servizi fondamentali o accede a servizi di scarsa qualità e chi non si sente riconosciuto non può sviluppare la propria persona e vivere come desidera. Vengono negati diritti e libertà, cresce il senso di ingiustizia, si vive come non si dovrebbe vivere in un paese

democratico dove, per dirla con Amartya Sen, lo sviluppo dovrebbe fare in modo che non esistano «illibertà» limitanti per la vita delle persone.

**Donne ristrette** Giulia Mantovani 2019 Il volume nasce dalla volontà di unire competenze e sensibilità diverse per posare lo sguardo sull'universo femminile "ristretto", multiforme e nello stesso tempo dotato di una forte identità comune. L'attenzione si sofferma su fattispecie restrittive che rispondono a ragioni diverse, si consumano secondo modalità e tempi propri ed entro luoghi di esecuzione specificamente dedicati. Nessuna di esse, però, può legittimamente abdicare al corredo garantistico attraverso il quale l'art. 13 della nostra Costituzione dà sostanza all'invulnerabilità della libertà personale. Tutte, invece, debbono rispettare il principio di eguaglianza, che non tollera il dissolversi forzato delle diversità sotto un trattamento ciecamente comune: la considerazione delle differenze di genere è una condizione essenziale della parità di genere. Tutte le realtà considerate descrivono comunità numericamente esigue. Rispetto agli uomini sono poche le donne detenute, internate, trattenute. E tuttavia esse sono portatrici di esigenze specifiche, che attendono risposte adeguate. I "piccoli" numeri della popolazione femminile a vario titolo ristretta favoriscono forme di concentrazione delle donne entro un numero limitato di strutture appositamente dedicate. Ne scaturiscono conseguenze di segno diverso, come testimoniano i contributi presenti nel volume. Possono risultare agevolate la considerazione delle specificità legate al genere e la ricerca di modelli d'intervento adeguati oppure possono consolidarsi forme di ghettizzazione ed emarginazione. Al fine di ricostruire lo stato dell'arte e rilevare punti di forza e criticità attraverso un costante raffronto tra norma e realtà, il volume mira ad integrare dialetticamente contributi che adottano punti di partenza differenti e complementari. This group of migrants faces the complex and demanding task of learning a language while either learning to read and write for the first time or developing their literacy skills. They rarely receive adequate instruction in terms of hours of tuition and targeted teaching approaches, whereas they are very often requested to take a compulsory written test. The reference guide contains: a definition of target users and learners; the rationale related to the development of the descriptors; principles for teaching literacy and second languages; scales and tables of descriptors; aspects of curriculum design at the macro, meso and micro levels and recommendations on assessment procedures and tools within the learning environment. **The Rights of Unaccompanied Minors** Yvonne Vissing 2021-07-22 This volume explores the various challenges faced by migrant unaccompanied children, using a clinical sociological approach and a global perspective. It applies a human rights and comparative framework to examine the reception of unaccompanied children in European, North American, South American, Asian and African countries. Some of the important issues the volume discusses are: access of displaced unaccompanied children to justice across

borders and juridical contexts; voluntary guardianship for unaccompanied children; the diverse but complementary needs of unaccompanied children in care, which if left unaddressed can have serious implications on their social integration in the host societies; and the detention of migrant children as analyzed against the most recent European and international human rights law standards. This is a one-of-a-kind volume bringing together perspectives from child rights policy chairs across the world on a global issue. The contributions reflect the authors' diverse cultural contexts and academic and professional backgrounds, and hence, this volume synthesizes theory with practice through rich firsthand experiences, along with theoretical discussions. **Migrants, Refugees and Asylum Seekers' Integration in European Labour Markets** Veronica Federico 2021-04-21 This open access book discusses how, and to what extent, the legal and institutional regimes and the socio-cultural environments of a range of European countries (the Czech Republic, Denmark, Finland, Greece, Italy, Switzerland and the UK), in the framework of EU laws and policies, have a beneficial or negative impact on the effective capacity of these countries to integrate migrants, refugees and asylum seekers into their labour markets. The analysis builds on the understanding of socio-cultural, institutional and legal factors as "barriers" or "enablers"; elements that may facilitate or obstruct the integration processes. The book examines the two dimensions of integration being access to the labour market (which, translated into a rights language means the right to work) with its corollaries (recognition of qualifications, vocational training, etc.), and non-discriminatory working conditions (which, translated into a rights language means right to both formal and substantial equality) and its corollaries of benefits and duties deriving from joining the labour market. It thereby offers a novel approach to labour market integration and migration/asylum issues given its focus on legal aspects, which includes most recent policy changes and legal decisions (including litigation cases). The robust, evidence-based and comparative research illustrated in the book provides academics and students, but also practitioners and policy makers, with up to date knowledge that will likely impact positively on policy changes needed to better address integration conundrums.

**Beyond Camps and Forced Labour** Suzanne Bardgett 2020-12-30 This book presents a selection of the newest research on themes amplified by the sixth annual Beyond Camps and Forced Labour conference on the post-Holocaust period, including 'displaced persons', reception and resettlement, exiles and refugees, trials and justice, reparation and restitution, and memory and testimony. Ageing with smartphones is about figuring out how best to live together, differently.
